

Dear CLIP community,

For the past two years, I have had the honor and privilege of serving as your CLIPCO President. During this time, we have accomplished so much together. Every year, our families generously donate hundreds of thousands of dollars during the Direct Give Campaign, enabling us to staff our classroom with instructional aides who provide crucial assistance to our teachers and enrich the learning experience of our children.

Beyond the school day, CLIPCO supports and runs many after-school activities and programs. These include a variety of cultural ASEP (after school enrichment program) classes to our award winning Chinese New Year parade team. In addition, we have brought our families and students together to celebrate and perform at the wonderful Mid Autumn Moon Festival and CNY Gala for the past three years.

Behind the scenes, CLIPCO made significant changes to improve the returns on our funds and reserves. Previously, funds were held in accounts earning near-zero interest. We now maintain FDIC-insured accounts earning 3.7% interest and short-term US treasuries earning 4.28% interest.

None of these achievements would have been possible without everyone's collective efforts and generosity. Thank you! I would also like to extend my sincere gratitude to our Vice President, Margaret Leung, who will serve as our next President. She is a great leader who is deeply committed to our CLIP program.





From our Math Kangaroo Lead, Volodymyr:

- This 2025 year, out of 156 registered students: 39 were top 20-ranked nationwide. Just for comparison, last 2024 year, out of 142 registered students: 9 were top 20-ranked nationwide.
- Exactly a quarter of our participants are top 20-ranked nationwide now compared to 6.3% last year. Considering that there are 557 students currently registered at John Muir, we can say that 7% of our students rank among the top 20 in math nationwide assuming all math-loving kids in the USA participate in Math Kangaroo.
- There are 10,339 students ranked top-20 in the country and 2,554 students ranked top-3 at the state level (39 and 2 respectively from John Muir Elementary)
