- New Business
  - ASEP update

- In the Past (Last year and Previous)
  - CUSD did the contracts for ASEP; CLIPCO would collect money for classes, the district would bill CLIPCO, CLIPCO would write CUSD a check and district would ask the Individual Contractors to fill timecards (Individual Contractors) / collect an Invoice (Businesses) and pay them
  - Contractors with businesses had a PSA (Professional Service Agreement)
  - Individual contractors were onboarded as district employees. The individual contractors had to do fingerprinting, TB and also trainings.
  - Adjunct teacher would watch over the classes, which CLIPCO paid for
- This Year
  - CUSD will not do contracts and we rent spaces at the school through Facilitron
  - CLIPCO will sign contracts and pay the contractors directly
  - This opens CLIPCO up to a lot of liability
  - There is no adjunct teacher in case anything happens either
  - Some of the individually contracted instructors also feel uncomfortable to continue
- Plan for this Year
  - ASEP classes that will continue
    - Crochet
    - o Dizi
    - Wushu
    - Robotics
    - Brush Painting (TBD in January)
  - ASEP classes that will not continue
    - o Erhu
    - Lion dance
    - Percussion
    - cooking
- How does miller after school stuff work on facilitron
  - japanese school- they book it themselves
  - usually school affiliated orgs have priority
  - in order to book on facilitron- company must have insurance and have certain criteria
  - for profit businesses have to pay substantive fees to book
- o context:
  - back in the day, CLIP was a program inside a neighborhood school, so thats prob why they allowed ASEP to help with the mission of CLIP

- now that CLIP has its own school, the district feels this to be too much of a liability
- should we be checking our own liability insurance? Now with this new change....?
- lets table this conversation- let Mr. Mach talk to district to find out more information about whats going on

#### APS Update

- Approx 59% of population of school has responded
- Permission to contact- 4.8% said no
  - all no email address have been deleted
  - will create email lists for topic interests
- for survey on events
  - highest was mid-autumn festival and lunar new year
    - minor lower interest in sports and cultural events
- volunteering
  - over 70% of households who responded volunteer in some way with CLIP
    - should be targeting those who are already volunteering instead of finding new people
- CLIPCO committees
  - lots of people said they're interested
    - most popular: book fair, science fair, yearbook, math kangaroo, events, technology
    - ASEP
- DGC-
  - 79% said yes; 11% said no; 10% said no
  - trick question of what the DGC does- (all options) but not one category got 100%
  - takeaway: need to be Better with messaging
  - are you interested in learning ways to donate to CLIPCO
    - target these people with tax offering
    - 42% have company matching
- next steps
  - keep results in google drive folder
  - share comment and email lists with relevant committee leads
  - interest in sharing any info in the CLIPPER
- DGC update-
  - 21% of goal: total donated so far is \$165k
  - o goal is \$800K total
  - donation month has officially started!!!
  - Pizza party for the highest participation grade; if we meet goal all students will receive T-shirt
- Bylaws
  - CLIPCO bylaws havn't been updated since 1998;
